An academy based on four key values...

Trinity Academy Bradford is here to serve the local community, and we are looking forward to welcoming students and parents.

Our ethos is based on four key values -Empathy, Honesty, Respect and Responsibility.

Striving for 100% attendance...

All of our students are encouraged to aim for 100% attendance. High attendance has a significant impact on results – year on year students who meet or exceed the academy's attendance target, achieve more in their GCSE examinations than those students who didn't.

As a parent/carer we encourage you to discuss with your child the importance of high attendance - they will not only achieve their potential, but will also be rewarded for maintaining excellent attendance and behaviour.

We understand that at times your child may be unable to attend due to illness or due to exceptional circumstances. If this is the case, you can contact us by either:

If we do not hear from you we will issue a text message to report your child is not in school and, ask you to contact us as part of our safeguarding procedures.

Students are very well supported at the academy, but if there are issues, either in the home or at the academy that may impact upon attendance, then the Year Managers are here to support you.

Simple, efficient and convenient communication

Trinity Academy Bradford is predominantly a paperless organisation

This means that the majority of communication, including letters, newsletters, the student progress reports and information about behaviour and achievement points will be issued electronically. Text messages will be used for urgent messages. Some key benefits include:

- Dedicated iPhone/Android app, My Child At School (MCAS) This provides a one stop shop to view all achievement and behaviour points, attendance information and student progress reports
- Student Progress Reports: these will be issued electronically, and stored electronically, allowing you to access previous reports quickly and easily

Please note, parents/carers can request communication in alternative formats where required.

Positive working relationships

At Trinity Academy, we hugely value a positive working relationship with parents/carers. We also believe in modelling positive behaviour, so that students witness how adults should behave. Our staff are always here to help but we do ask that they are treated with respect and courtesy. I'm sure all our new parents will be happy to support us with this.

All Year 7 students join our Graduation programme

At Trinity Academy Bradford, our Year 8 students 'Graduate' at the end of Phase One. This aims to raise their aspirations and help make students feel more motivated for their upcoming GCSE studies.

As Year 7 students, your child will be enrolled in the programme and work towards graduating from Phase One. At the end of their two year journey, parents will be invited to celebrate their child's achievements at a memorable ceremony, complete with traditional cap and gown. Being able to graduate requires students to meet a number of minimum requirements around behaviour, attendance, meeting subject targets and participation in extra-curricular and public speaking events.

Students are regularly updated and advised so they are aware of their progress towards these targets. All students receive a Graduation Journal, so they can check whether they are on track and set targets accordingly. Graduation targets are explored in more detail at Parental Consultation Evenings, but parents can also discuss these with their child at home before each term begins.

Year 7 Knowledge Organisers

As part of the curriculum at Trinity Academy Bradford, students are required to gain key knowledge in all their subjects. To support this acquisition of knowledge, all students will be provided with 'Knowledge Organisers' for English, Maths, Science, History, Geography, Religious Studies, Computer Science, Curriculum for Life and Spanish. As part of their weekly homework, students will be expected to revise from each Knowledge Organiser in preparation for a Masters Of Recall test which takes place three times a year.

This knowledge will equip them not only to understand each subject in more depth and set the foundations for GCSE study, but will also help them to understand the world around them.



Structure of the academy day and punctuality

Lessons start at 8.30am and the first bell rinas at 8.25am. All students are expected to be on-site ready for the first bell. Students who are not in the building at 8.25am when the first bell rings will receive a late mark.

Punctuality is a key focus at the academy - not only does this ensure that our young people get the most from their lessons, it also helps them prepare for a professional environment in the future.

Lessons last one hour and the academy operates a three break and lunch system. The table opposite summarises breaks by year group. Students in Year 7—10 finish the academy day at 2.35pm. At this point students will participate in our Involve, and Graduation activities.

ParentPay is a nationally recognised, secure online system that allows you to pay the academy for everything from meals to trips. By topping up your account your child can make the most of their breaks.

Benefits of the system include:

- Completely secure and easy to use
- You can see what food your child has been purchasing
- Saves you from searching for cash and improves the security of payments
- If your child receives Free School Meals you can top this up, so they can make a purchase in the morning or at break
- Pay for trips in affordable instalments
- Support available if you are unsure of how it works.

Support for students at Trinity Academy Bradford

Transition support

Our staff work to support students as they move from primary to secondary school and ensure that this is as smooth as possible.

The support that we put in place will differ depending on the individual student. It could range from simply answering questions to putting some specific support systems in place. We also meet with staff in primary schools to gain a better understanding of the students who are going to be joining the academy.

The Year Manager Team

At the heart of our pastoral system are our Year Managers. Each year group is headed by a Year Manager and is supported by Deputy Year Managers, who take responsibility for the leadership of pastoral care and support of students within each year group.

The team has a fantastic relationship with the students in their care.

Professional **Standards**

Trinity Academy Bradford is committed to upholding the highest standards and expectations. Our Professional Standards serve as a guide for all staff, students, and stakeholders to adhere to in order to foster a positive learning environment. By upholding these standards, Trinity Academy Bradford aims to promote a culture of excellence, accountability, and mutual respect within the academy and wider community.

The Professional Standards help students prepare for the future and remind them of the importance of requirements such as impeccable uniform, punctuality and being equipped to learn at all times.

The Professional Standards are displayed in all classrooms and in the Personal Organiser, and serve as a reminder for students and staff in each and every lesson.

Students who consistently meet our expectations are rewarded with Achievement Points - see below.

Recognising excellent behaviour

Trinity Academy has a real focus on rewarding excellent behaviour, and ensuring students understand the consequences of any poor behaviour.

The academy has a clear Behaviour for Learning Policy which outlines how positive behaviour is celebrated, and how any issues will be addressed. We recognise students' good behaviour through achievement points, which are awarded when students meet our expectations. A behaviour point is given when a student has failed to meet our expectations, and will affect the overall balance of points and subsequent eligibility for rewards.

Trinity Academy has comprehensive support in place for all students. We are determined that each and every student will get the most from their time here.

Uniform success...

- Blazer worn correctly with sleeves fully rolled down
- Shirt/blouse fully buttoned with tie worn correctly
- Smart black trousers /pleated skirt skirts with official academy logo
- Smart black shoes please note that pumps, suede footwear, boots and black trainers are not allowed
- Mobile telephones cannot be used at any point during the academy day please remember they will be confiscated if they are seen.

A smart uniform is crucial to success at Trinity Academy. Please note that we do not allow pumps, long boots or black trainers to be worn. If a belt is worn this must be plain black leather (or leather look) with a non-decorative buckle. Students are also not allowed to bring hoodies to the academy. The academy uniform policy must be followed on students' journey to and from the academy.

The role of the Personal Organiser...

All students are supplied with their own Personal Organiser. This is a vital piece of equipment and students are expected to bring it to the academy each day.

It is also a useful tool for you - here you can view a record of the homework your child has been set, and see a weekly record of their behaviour and attendance.
