Achieve your goals...

Over the year your net points accumulate and you will be recognised for your success at three special levels. These are:



Bronze:

a special achievement, you will be given your first badge

Silver:

the next step, you have earned your silver badge!



Gold:

the absolute goal, if you are given a gold badge you achieved the highest level

When you reach each star stage, you will be recognised.

Inclusion – reflective practice in Inclusion +


Off site inclusion

Communication - ParentPay

- An easy cashless system that allows you to pay for your child's meals/trips/events
